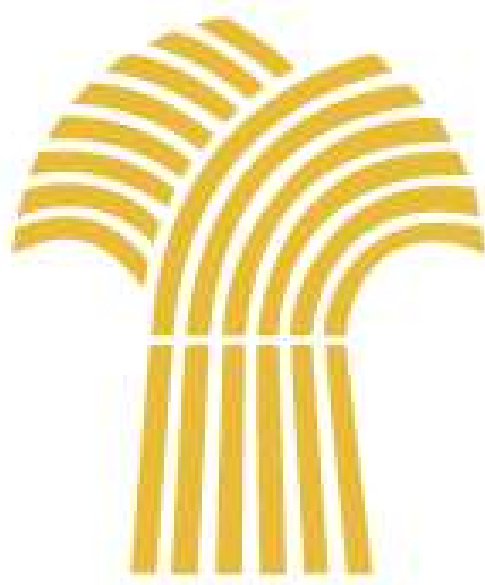

ENTRY DEADLINE

Closing date of entries is **9:00 PM CST-SK on Sunday, August 9, 2026.**

Only online registrations will be accepted.

Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Technical Representative only if space permits and will be subject to double the entry fee. **No entries will be accepted after Friday, August 14, 2026 at 12:00 PM (noon) CST-SK. No exceptions.** Confirmations will be sent by email to competitors and coaches following the closing date of entries. Information will also be posted on the Skate Saskatchewan website.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RULES & ELIGIBILITY

The 2026 Sask Skate Competition is sanctioned by Skate Canada. All events will be conducted in accordance with the regulations as outlined by Skate Canada or the International Skating Union as applicable. Competitors must be eligible skaters as defined in the Skate Canada Rule Book, Competitions, and be registered skaters in good standing with a Skate Canada affiliated club or skating school.

2. CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES

All registrations must be completed online with entry fees **no later than 9:00 PM (CST-SK) on Sunday, August 9, 2026**. Test qualifications are as of August 9, 2026. All age qualifications are as of July 1, 2026.

If only one entry is received for an event, the Host Committee reserves the right to cancel the event and refund the entry fee to the competitor. Competitors will be notified following the entry deadline if such circumstance arises.

IMPORTANT: Planned Program & Music (see music details below) must be submitted online at the time of registration. Online updates may be made up to 9:00 PM (CST-SK) on September 14, 2026. **Music will not be accepted onsite.**

LATE ENTRIES: Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Technical Representative only if space permits in the event. Entries received after the deadline will be double the entry fee. Late entries may be accepted up to five (5) business days after the registration deadline. **No entries will be accepted after August 14, 2026, at 12:00 PM (CST-SK). No exceptions.**

3. MUSIC

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs, either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

IMPORTANT: Music files must be clearly labelled with the competitor's first & last name and event and must be submitted online at the time of registration. Updates to music may be made up to 9:00 PM (CST-SK) on September 14, 2026. **Music will not be accepted on-site.** Competitors are required to have a backup USB Flash drive for each program (clearly labelled with the competitor's first & last name and event) rink side in case there is a problem with the uploaded music. Alternate electronic devices such as iPhones, tablets, etc. will not be accepted.

Pattern Dance Music – Competitors must submit their own pattern dance music, even if using Skate Canada Series 8 or an ISU music selection.

Competitors entering multiple events should be aware that there may be scheduling conflicts resulting in less-than-ideal scheduling, or that are unable to be resolved.

Please refer to [Skate Canada Rule Book](#) and/or [ISU website](#) for the applicable competition program requirements, age requirements, and program lengths for the 2026/2027 season for each event. Competitors may skate up one category higher than they are qualified for.

In the case of a large number of entries in a category, a flight system will be used to divide competitors. Flights will be determined by random draw.

6. REFUNDS

No refunds will be issued for any reason after the closing date of entries. All refunds prior to the deadline will be subject to a 25% Administration Fee.



7. PRACTICE ICE

Practice sessions are not included in the entry fee. Information regarding practice ice will be communicated once the competition schedule is available.

8. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

9. COACH ACCREDITATION

Coach accreditation is dependent on the competition category and corresponding NCCP Certification. All requirements must be valid prior to and on-site during the event.

Skate Canada Coaches in good standing who are in the process of achieving an NCCP certification may be considered for accreditation provided they have an in-training or trained status in the same context that certification is required. Approval as such is granted by the Section.

Non-resident coaches who do not have an NCCP status may be considered for accreditation provided that valid screening is provided at the time of competition entry and on-site at the event.



Skate Canada is no longer providing Coach ID Cards. The following Saskatchewan Competition Accreditation process will be followed:

- Coaches with the status “In Good Standing” with Skate Canada will receive accreditation for competitions provided they meet the minimum NCCP Certification Requirements.
- Coaches who are not eligible to receive accreditation will be contacted prior to the competition.
- Coaches will be required to sign in with photo ID to obtain their competition accreditation for the 2026/2027 season.
- Accreditation Tag is valid for the 2026/2027 season and is required to gain access to back of house areas including rink side at all Saskatchewan competitions.

Only competitors and accredited coaches will be permitted in the dressing room and rink side areas.

10. ON-SITE REGISTRATION

Competitors must register at least one (1) hour prior to the scheduled start time of their first event but no earlier than 45 minutes before the first event of the day.

11. STARTING ORDERS & RESULTS

All Starting Orders and Results will only be posted online. Paper copies will not be posted in the venue or provided to competitors.

12. AWARDS

Medals will be awarded for the top three placements in each event of the competition following the posting of results. Medalists are expected to wear their skates and skating attire for medal presentations.

13. LIVE STREAMING

The event may be photographed and/or live streamed. By virtue of your registration for the competition, you are consenting to being included in the live streaming/photography of this event that will help to train others and to promote skating in Canada. You release Skate Saskatchewan, its officers, employees, and each and all persons involved from any liability connected with the video & audio recordings. By attending and competing at the competition, you waive any right to inspect or approve any video or audio recordings taken by Skate Saskatchewan.

If you do not wish to have your competitor photographed or live streamed, inform the Event Manager, Danielle Shaw. We cannot guarantee that you will not be photographed or live streamed, but we will do our best to accommodate the request.

14. ACCIDENTS

Skate Canada, Skate Saskatchewan, and the Host Committee undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by competitors. As a condition of and consideration of their entry in this competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by, or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions. An agreement must also be deemed to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, Skate Canada, Skate Saskatchewan, the Host Committee, and their officers. Entries shall be accepted only in accordance with these conditions.
